Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of **SUYOG GURBAXANI FUNICULAR ROPEWAYS LIMITED**, which comprise the Balance Sheet as at **31**st **March 2023**, the statement of Profit and Loss and statement of cash flows for the year ended on that date, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information:
